


Using This Guide:

respiteservices.com connects agencies funded by the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services with families looking for respite. We are collaborating to develop a more dynamic respite network for both children with developmental and physical disabilities and adults who are eligible with DSO (Developmental Services Ontario).

As a caregiver, we know your time is limited. We hope you can use this guide to help you through the process of accessing respite and additional resources. Please note that every effort was made to ensure that all information is up to date and accurate. This list is not exhaustive and other respite options and programs may exist. Please contact agencies directly for most up to date information.

We have broken down the information into four sections to help you navigate and coordinate respite and funding options.



- 1. The benefits of a break section defines the importance of respite and how it can benefit all members of the family.
- 2. Respite Options will explore both in and out of home respite options.
- 3. Funding and Resources will give options in how to fund your respite opportunities and other helpful resources.
- 4. The Short Break Planner is a tool to inform respite providers about the support needs of your family member. It can also be used to plan your respite for the year.

Benefits of a Break:

Respite care provides a short planned break from the physical and emotional demands involved in caring for a family member who has a disability. Respite creates greater opportunities for all family members to live actively and participate in community activities. It also allows parents/caregivers time for themselves to pursue hobbies, meet with friends, rest, or even catch up on housework.

Look what some of our families are saying about how respite has impacted their lives:

"Respite gives us the opportunity to aid (our daughter) in her interactions with other children that will support her continued social and communication skills. Along with giving my wife and I the needed physical and mental breaks, we use this time to rest and restore energy so our family time together is more rewarding for everyone"

"Respite means that I can gather strength and energy to do all the caregiving. I'm a single mom and he only sees his father every other weekend. I need a break so that I can be at my best the rest of the time. Working full time and trying to manage (his) needs leaves me mostly exhausted. I'd really like time to clean the house or do some yoga"

"Respite should be more than a break from life's circumstances, it should be a change of life's circumstances"



Respite Options – CHAP

The Chap Program (Community Helpers for Active Participation) is an integral part of respiteservices.com. For over 20 years the CHAP program has been Toronto's leading resource for one-to-one support.

The respiteservices.com/supportyourway.ca website is a free online information service that local organizations throughout Ontario support for the benefit of people with disabilities, their families and individual service providers in the community. The website includes a database through which people with disabilities and/or their families can make their support needs known, and through which Independent Respite Providers can offer their services.

The Independent Respite Provider Database is updated regularly as new Independent Respite Providers join the Independent Respite Provider Database and successful matches are made.

Independent Respite Providers vary in experience, skill sets, and availability, and should not be considered trained therapists, who are available for part-time parent/caregiver relief, to provide support in the family home or in the community. This may include one-to-one support in the community and assisting families to implement recommendations made by a qualified therapist (e.g. Speech Language Pathologist or Occupational Therapist).
